



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2011/37

**Consumer pineapple
 Exported from the Republic of the Philippines
 Finding in relation to a review of anti-dumping measures**

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

The Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (Customs and Border Protection) has completed its review of the anti-dumping measures applying to consumer pineapple exported to Australia from the Republic of the Philippines (the Philippines). The review commenced on 4 February 2011.

Customs and Border Protection reported its findings and recommendations to the Minister for Home Affairs (the Minister) in International Trade Remedies Report No. 172b (REP 172b). The Minister has considered REP 172b and has accepted Customs and Border Protection's recommendations.

Under s. 269ZDB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), the Minister declared, for the purposes of the Act and the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* to the extent that anti-dumping measures concerning the goods involved the publication of a dumping duty notice that, with effect from the date of publication of the s.269ZDB(1) notice, the dumping duty notice relevant to the measures applicable to consumer pineapple exported from the Philippines is to be taken to have effect, as if different variable factors had been fixed, relevant to the determination of duty.

Notice of the Minister's decision was published in *The Australian* newspaper and the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette on 30 August 2011. The revised measures will apply to those goods exported from the Philippines and entered for home consumption from the date of publication of the Minister's decision on 30 August 2011.



The effective rates of duty imposed on imports of consumer pineapple from the Philippines are:

Exporter	Dumping Rate
Dole Philippines	2.6%
All Other Exporters	15.0%

To preserve confidentiality, details of the revised variable factors will not be published. Bona fide importers of the goods can obtain details of the new rates from the Regional Dumping Liaison Officer in their respective capital city.
